Building Fact Fluency

The Division has recently received and is working to distribute a Division-wide order of the Building Fact Fluency companion resource, a Toolkit for Multiplication and Division!

The toolkit supports the development of number sense through a variety of tasks that focus on fluency, reasoning and problem solving. This resource is laid out in an accessible way for teachers to teach basic facts through conceptual understanding and mathematical relationships.

It also connects multiplication and division facts to contextual problems, drawing connections between math manipulatives and the real world. This provides entry points for all of the Division's diverse learners.

Thank you to our Numeracy Steering Committees and piloting teachers for their work and resulting recommendations of this additional instructional resource. Another thank you to the Board of Trustees and Executive Council for providing funds to ensure all schools have access to this resource.
