Treasurer's Report

- Added \$7,081.70 into school budget account from popcorn fundraiser.
- Wasn't enough money to budget for field trips at the beginning of the year. Stacey proposed moving \$5000 towards field trips this year, and is looking to put it to a vote.
- Candice asked how field trips work and money is allocated (ie. per grade, per classroom).
 - Typical fieldtrip budget is \$10,000. Connie stated that the budget is reasonable to be less as Lakeview has lost 5 classrooms since last year. Staff will place proposals for in person and virtual field trips.
 - Field trip budget has historically been so high due to busing costs.

- 1. LST Highlights (Phil Williams, LST teacher)
- What does a Learning Support Teacher Do?
 - Learning Support teachers are very important towards the Inclusive education system. In the school, it looks like creating opportunities for every child to access learning.
 - Role is to build capacity for teachers. The model has transitioned from removing children from classrooms to pushing supports into the classrooms (ie. ELL services, OT services, Student support worker, Speech Language Pathologists, etc).
- 2. Re-defining Space
- In order for universal learning strategies to be effective, we need to redefine the space.
 One of these spaces in Lakeview is our stage potentially looking to repurpose this area for children who may need to be more active during the day. Phil and Connie working together to transition these spaces.
 - Learning commons working on becoming a maker's space where kids are creating.
 - Creating an art room for the first time in a long time.
- 3. Cold Weather
 - a. Dressing for all Weather
 - i. Emphasizing to children the importance of dressing for the weather.
 - ii. Will be accessing clothes to make same available for children who are in need.
 - iii. Kara asked if the school takes in used winter clothing to distribute.
 Connie responded that absolutely Lakeview will accept donations, please contact the office to donate.
 - b. Severe Weather Policy
