- Come and check out our student and community dancers! We hope to see you there!





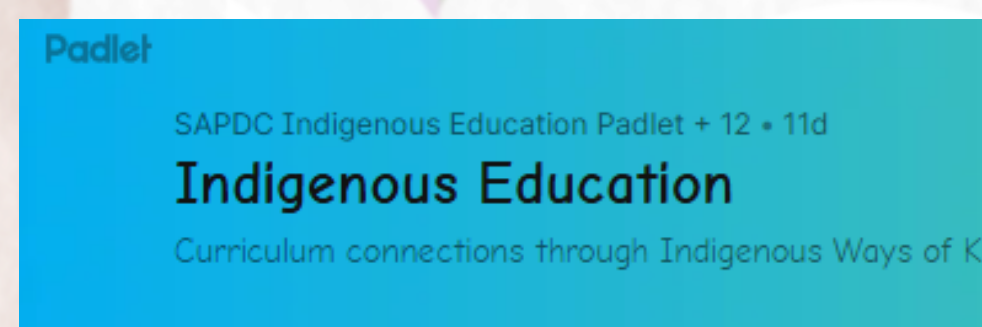
Indigenous Education Graduation Ceremony & Indigenous Honour night
